AREAS OF INTEREST

Marine biodiversity



Terrestrial biodiversity

Sicily is a major biodiversity hotspot for coastal and marine life. It is also a region with one of the highest numbers of Marine Protected Areas in Italy; its spectacular coastlines and large number of islands are crucial ecosystems which must be protected. Sicily has one of the highest levels of floral diversity in the Mediterranean region. Human disturbance, including wildfires and unsustainable agriculture, threaten biodiversity and damage economic and social activities related to nature and rural areas.

3 Sustainable food systems

Sicily's landscape has changed significantly due to human activities. Land use is dominated by agriculture, creating a mosaic of many traditional rural landscapes, threatened by degradation and modern agricultural methods.



Sicily is particularly vulnerable to climate change. Waste management is also a pressing concern. Action and adaptation plans to tackle pollution require ecosystem-based and interdisciplinary approaches which take into account physical and cultural elements.









OUR WORK

CAPER PLANT NURSERY IN STROMBOLI

Attiva Stromboli

A caper plant nursery has been set up on land previously devastated and abandoned by wildfires. The local community has been managing and restoring the land, protecting it from fire outbreaks and reducing the hydrogeological risk. Drystone walls, terraces and an agricultural cistern were restored. An irrigation system was also installed, powered by a solar panel.





REWILDING GUIDE TRAINING

Astrid Natura, Collettivo Rewild Sicily, Riccio Blu - Patronage Dipartimento Ambiente Regione Siciliana

Nature guides from different corners of Sicily joined the rewilding training, aimed at valuing their knowledge as territorial custodians. Through the use of innovative tools for environmental interpretation, they will monitor biodiversity and human impact, providing data for evidence-based land management, fire prevention and future rewilding measures.

GHOST NETS RECOVERY IN USTICA



Mare Nostrum Diving, Ustica Island MPA

Abandoned and lost fishing nets have been collected in the Ustica's Marine Protected Area, contributing to restore marine habitats. Students from the Biological, Geological and Environmental Sciences Department of the University of Catania conducted a study on the fauna associated with ghost nets. A documentary on the project has been produced, to share experiences and inspire future action.

KEY NUMBERS

- 500 kg of ghost nets have been recovered
- 5 sites cleaned in the MPA

PLASTIC FREE SCHOOLS SMALL ISLANDS

Marevivo Sicilia

This project tackles plastic pollution in schools on the small islands of Sicily. A competition engaging is students and teachers in a campaign to reduce plastic usage. The three winning schools are awarded with water filtration machines and reusable water bottles. This project has been supported by Depeche Mode and Hublot through the Memento Mori Tour charity partnership with Conservation Collective.


"RESPONSEABLE CONSUMPTION" GUIDE

It outlines seasonality, fishing method, risk of extinction and minimum catch size for 26 marine species commonly found in the Mediterranean.
