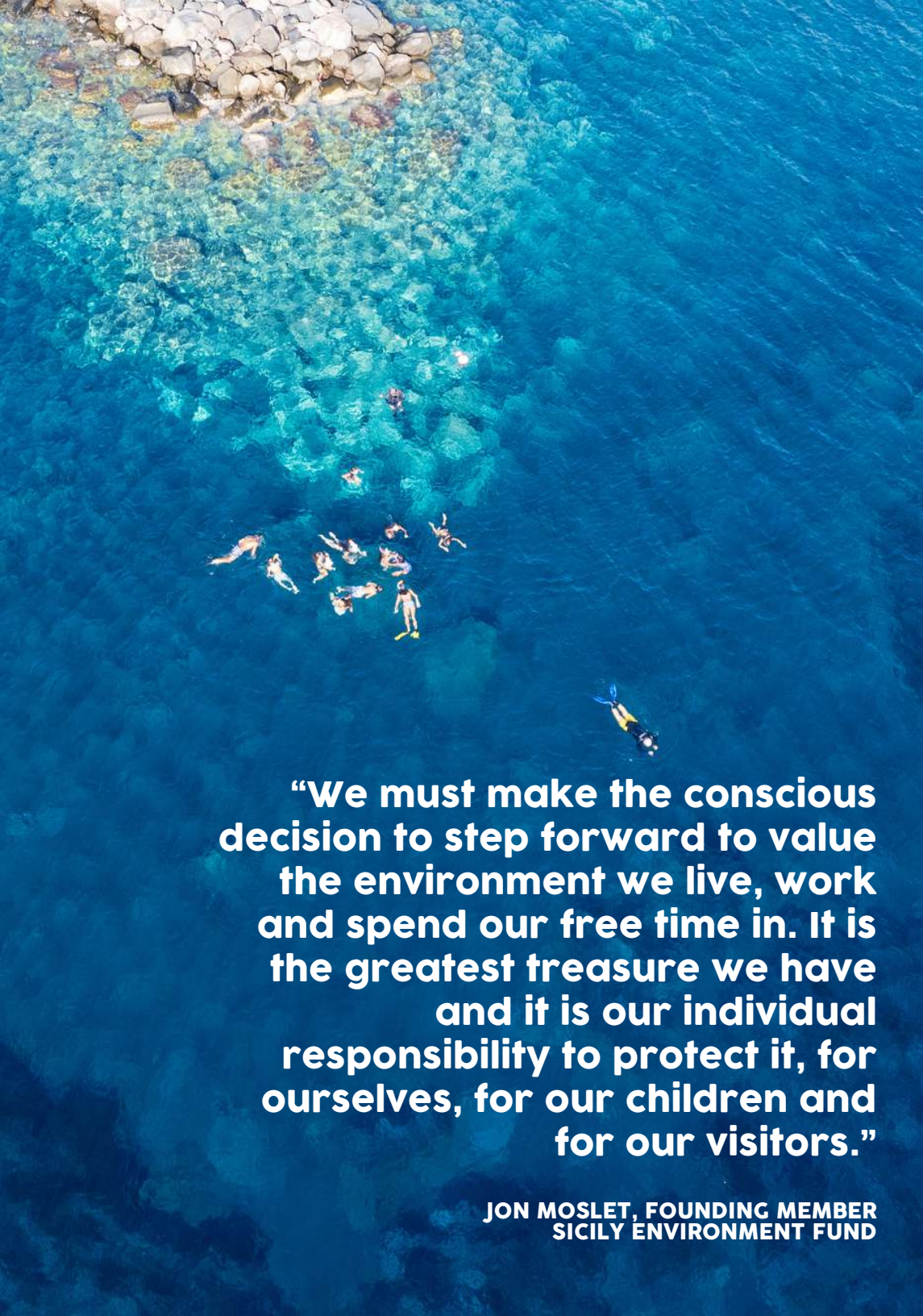

Gaia, MSc in Ecology and Conservation, has been active in conservation over the past 10 years, working with grassroot organisations in Italy and abroad. She has been involved in community-based projects and protected areas management, fostering participatory and co-creation approaches to tackle environmental challenges.



AREAS OF INTEREST

1 Marine conservation

Sicily is a key biodiversity hotspot for coastal and marine life. Protecting its ecosystems entails monitoring species, restoring habitats, enforcing Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) and engaging with local stakeholders and artisanal fishers, to ensure long-term ecological health.



2 Terrestrial conservation

Sicily has one of the highest levels of floral diversity in the Mediterranean region. Restoration and rewilding initiatives, fire prevention, and species monitoring can help halt the decline of biodiversity and prevent the damage to economic and social activities linked to nature and rural areas.



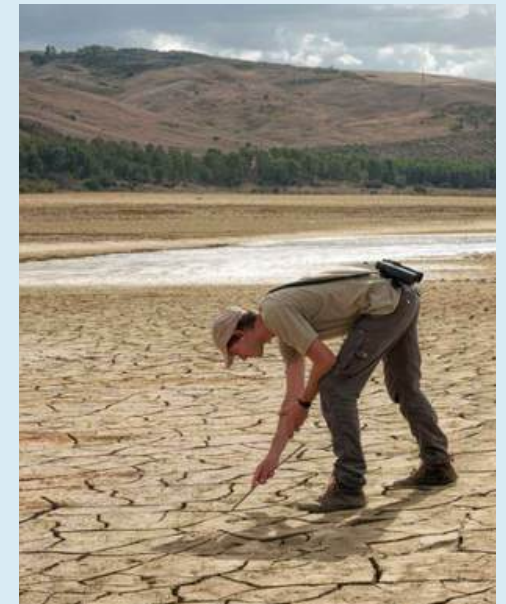
3 Sustainable food systems

Sicily's landscape has been significantly altered by human activities. Adopting agroecology as a holistic approach, in support of small farmers, can help improve water management and protect traditional rural landscapes threatened by land abandonment and unsustainable agricultural practices, thereby countering environmental degradation.



4 Ecological transition

Sicily is highly vulnerable to climate change, facing more frequent extreme weather events. Adaptation measures must adopt ecosystem-based and interdisciplinary approaches to foster responsible waste management, water security, ecotourism and community-led renewable energy.



OUR PROJECTS

ARTISANAL FISHERS IN CORALS RESTORATION

Stazione Zoologica Anton Dohrn

The project involves artisanal fishers in the restoration of coralligenous habitats in the Marine Protected Area of Capo Gallo and Isola delle Femmine. The ecological survey is providing important data on ecosystem health. Local fishers will be trained by University of Barcelona on the recovery of coral fragments and restoration procedures. Thanks to Studio Forward and Officine Grafiche support, an awareness campaign will highlight the importance of the MPA and of coral-reef populations. The project has received support from Grimaldi Palermo Euroterminal.



UNPACKED SHOPPING

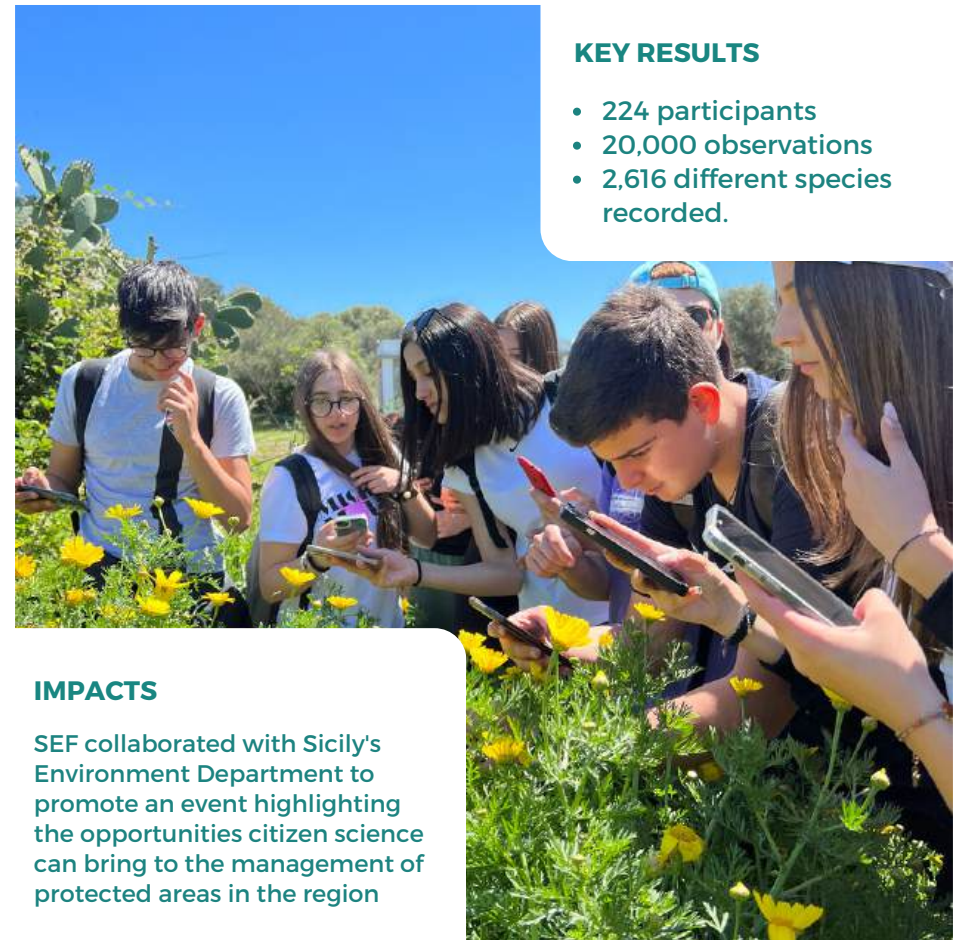
Rifiuti Zero Sicilia

This pilot project is creating a community of businesses and consumers that embraces "purchase without packaging". The goal is to reduce single-use packaging and promote a change in daily habits, such as using reusable containers for groceries and takeaways, adopting eco-friendly practices at home, and promoting sustainability at events. The project is supported thanks to funding received from Conservation Collective through their Depeche Mode and Hublot partnership.

CITY NATURE CHALLENGE

Muma Museum of the Sea Milazzo

An international citizen science event whereby cities around the world encourage participants to share their observations of nature via iNaturalist app, raising awareness of biodiversity and promoting environmental education. Milazzo ranked 1st in Italy for the number of species and observations, 3rd in Europe, and 25th globally. Promoting such initiatives is crucial in amplifying the potential of citizen science to gather data on protected areas' biodiversity. The project has received support from Esplora Travel.



KEY RESULTS

- 224 participants
- 20,000 observations
- 2,616 different species recorded.

IMPACTS

SEF collaborated with Sicily's Environment Department to promote an event highlighting the opportunities citizen science can bring to the management of protected areas in the region



SALINA BLUE ISLAND

Nesos, Kurma, Condotta Isole Slow

This project focuses on engaging and empowering the local community ahead of the establishment of the Marine Protected Area of Salina, the first in the Aeolian Islands. Educational activities and stakeholders' workshops involve restaurants, fishers, schools and the tourism sector. A strong focus is on eco-tourism and local sustainable seafood consumption, as well featuring a snorkelling programme for students.

Together with Blue Marine Foundation, SEF are committed to supporting local efforts towards marine conservation and sustainable development on the island of Salina.

COMMON GROUND: TERRITORIAL PLANNING TO PREVENT WILDFIRES

Collettivo Rewild Sicily (In partnership with the Department of Agricultural, Food, and Forest Sciences of the University of Palermo and Pro Loco Alfofonte)

Alfofonte is a area which was significantly affected by wildfires in 2023. The local community there has been involved in the development of guidelines for territorial planning to reduce the incidence of fires through sustainable land-use and traditional agro-pastoral practices. Participatory approaches are adopted for territorial planning, setting the foundations for policy tools. Measures to prevent wildfires have been implemented. This project provides a pilot case which can be replicated across the region.



AGROECOLOGY FOR ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION OF THE PLAIN OF GELA

CEA ODV (Geloi Wetland)

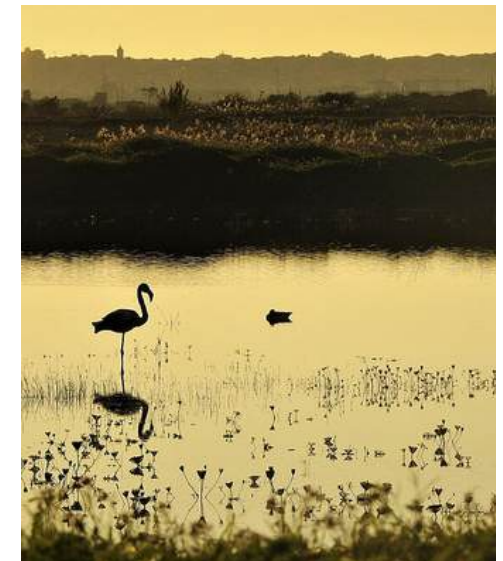
In order to restore valuable ecosystems on the Plain of Gela, this project is implementing agroecological practices in Geloi Wetland, a private conservation area.

Training sessions for local farmers will promote sustainable agriculture, rewilding, land regeneration and fire prevention. Through challenging unsustainable practices such as the use of fire, stubble ploughing, stone removal, and reduced perennial greenery, vital habitats will be restored for key bird species (Lesser kestrel, European roller, Crested lark) while strengthening agricultural resilience of the area.

SAVING AGROBIODIVERSITY IN WESTERN SICILY

Associazione FICUS

Local farmers in Marsala and Trapani are identifying ancient crop varieties at risk of extinction and adopting sustainable agriculture techniques. Crops will be propagated and cultivated at the FICUS educational centre and in surrounding farms, involving youths with disabilities and vulnerable immigrants, under the guidance of certified operators in horticultural therapy. The initiative is a complementary to the FOOD project (Ficus Beyond All Disabilities), in collaboration with ANFFAS, funded by the local government.
